

Introduction

I began recommending Christian books to students decades ago for the purpose of helping them know about some of the better resources available to them. Many of the books were about Bible study, theology, discipleship, Church history and apologetics. The response was almost always positive, so I decided to review books online to help even more students know about books that would both inform and challenge. Most of the books I review are new or of recent origin.

Book Review Volume VIII is the eighth in a series about books on the primary subject of "Apologetics" on FaithandSelfDefense.com. Another series you may find helpful is *A Reading Plan For Christian Apologists*, also on FaithandSelfDefense.com.

Our hope is that you will find books you can add to your Christian library — books that will become your friends and allies as you grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.



The Christian in Complete Armour was published by Banner of Truth Trust in 1986. William Gurnall (1616–1679) wrote a massive theological work looking deeply into Spiritual Warfare between Christians and Satan. Gurnall published the 1,240 page work in 1662.

The original title was *The Christian In Complete Armour; A Treatise Of the Saints' War against the Devil.* Gurnall was Pastor of the Church of Christ in Lavenham, Suffolk, England.

This is, in my opinion, the best and most thorough treatise on the subject of Spiritual Warfare that I've ever read. I highly recommend that every Christian purchase a copy of Volume I (\$9.99 Kindle, \$12.00 Paperback) to get started or invest in the three-volume set for \$26.00 (Paperback). You will not be disappointed. I think you very well may read through the volume(s) every year as an important reminder of the battle we all face every day with the enemy.

This amazing book is available from Banner of Truth as a complete unabridged edition (\$43.20 Paperback) and in three modernized abridged volumes.

Here is the publisher's description of the unabridged edition.

Gurnall's *Christian in Complete Armour*, certainly one of the greatest of all the Puritan's practical writings, has been many times republished, but the best edition remains that of 1864, with an Introduction by J.C. Ryle. It is this unabridged edition which is now reprinted.

This *Complete Armour* is beyond all others a preacher's book: I should think that more discourses have been suggested by it than by any other uninspired volume. I have often resorted to it when my own fire has been burning low, and I have seldom failed to find a glowing coal upon Gurnall's hearth. John Newton said that if he might read only one book beside the Bible, he would choose *The Christian in Complete Armour*, and Richard Cecil was of much the same opinion.



I highly recommend you invest in Volume I at a minimum. When you do, I believe you will purchase the entire set. It is necessary to every Christian to understand the battle we are in with Satan and his evil forces.



The Universe Next Door: A Basic Worldview Catalog is now available in a Sixth Edition (IVP Academic, 2020). Even though the first edition was published in 1976, many Christians are not familiar with this fine book.

The author is James Sire, a well-known Christian apologist and lecturer who passed away several years ago (1933-2018). He authored more than 20 books in addition to being a senior editor for InterVarsity Press.

The Universe Next Door is one of the better-known Christian apologetics books of the last 45 years. First written in 1976, it has gone through five update editions (1988, 1997, 2004, 2009, 2020). Each edition has added important information to the original book. Whether you have or have never read the book, I highly recommend the 6th Edition.

Sire wrote this about the reason for writing the first edition of the book:

"I first wrote the book for Christian students in the mid-1970s; it was designed to help them identify why they often felt so 'out of it' when their professors assumed the truth of ideas they deemed odd or even false. I wanted these students to know the outlines of a 'merely' Christian worldview, how it provided the foundation for much of the modern Western world's understanding of reality, and what the differences were between the Christian worldview and the various worldviews that either stemmed from Christianity by variation and decay, or encountered Christianity at its very intellectual roots." I was a college student in the mid-1960s and turned toward atheism through the efforts of an atheist professor who relentlessly attacked Christianity in his classroom. I can certainly understand why Sire wrote the first edition of his book ten years later.

College professors are still attacking Christianity today, so it's a good time to remind students and their parents of the importance of understanding worldviews and how to respond to them as Christians. I also recommend *The Universe Next Door* for teachers, pastors and youth workers in churches and youth-related ministries. Add it to your library and consider giving it to friends and family. You might also use it as a study guide for small groups in your church.
